Last week our 'goal-setting' interviews were held. There was an excellent turn-out of parents. We really appreciate parents attending for a number of reasons:

- An opportunity for teachers to get to know more about their students
- An opportunity for parents to find out about their children's class programmes
- An opportunity to share reminders like, yes your child does have homework, have you seen their homework book etc

TOYS AT SCHOOL

Recently we have had a number of children bringing toys to school to play with at playtimes and lunchtimes. We would appreciate these remaining at home so they can't be broken or lost at school which leads to hassles.

SWIMMING POOL SEASON

Traditionally the school pool closes towards the end of March. Class swimming has finished now. So the last weekend for pool keyholders to use the pool is this weekend which means the pool will be officially closed from Monday 27th March. Please return your key to the school office.

ACHIEVEMENT TARGETS

Each year we identify a number of school-wide and syndicate achievement targets. Each syndicate determine which ones they wish to focus on and boost achievement in specific curriculum areas. The Board and staff also devise school-wide achievement targets that must be based on *National Standards* outcomes in Reading, Writing and Mathematics from the previous year. Action Plans are developed and evaluated mid-year and at the end-of-year. We have 2 main school-wide literacy targets this year:

- To significantly reduce the percentage of Year 2 students in the 'Well Below' and 'Below' categories by 1st November 2017 from 54% (1st November 2016) to 20%. **READING TARGET.**
- To significantly reduce the percentage of male students in the 'Well Below' and 'Below' categories by 1st November 2017 from 28% (1st November 2016) to 20%. Special emphasis on reducing the percentage of Year 3 2017 (from 35%), Year 4 2017 (from 50%) and Year 6 2017 (from 27%) in the 'Well Below' and 'Below' categories by 1st November 2017. **WRITING TARGET.**

No doubt parents may be concerned about some of the percentages. However, I would like to point out how wonderfully successful our children are by the time they leave Richmond School in literacy and in mathematics. Historical information certainly shows this. For example, information presented in our recently reviewed Charter 1st March 2017 reiterate this (snippets only noted here).

- **READING** Overall, 80.4% of our students' school-wide are 'At' or 'Above'. Especially pleasing is our Year 6 group with 93% that are 'At' or 'Above'. The latter being consistent with historic information that the majority of our pupils leaving Richmond School as Year 6s are reading 'At' or 'Above' the *National Standard*. In fact, our Year 4-6 percentages (90% or more) are very impressive. We believe our high quality reading programmes (classroom and targeted programmes such as *Reading Recovery, Multi-Lit, Rainbow Reading, Lexia* and *Reading Plus*) are having a significant impact.
- WRITING Overall, 79.5% of our students' school-wide are 'At' or 'Above'.
 Again, especially pleasing is our Year 6 group with 91% that are 'At' or 'Above'. The latter being consistent with historic information that the majority of our pupils leaving Richmond School as Year 6s are writing 'At' or 'Above' the National Standard.
- MATHEMATICS Overall, 84.2% of our students' school-wide are 'At' or 'Above'.
 Again, especially pleasing is our Year 6 group with 89% that are 'At' or 'Above'. The latter being consistent with historic information that the majority of our pupils leaving Richmond School as Year 6s are performing 'At' or 'Above' the National Standard.


