JESS DRUMMOND – ABOUT TO BECOME A DUAL INTERNATIONAL

The unavailability of five key players has opened the door for Richmond School teacher to make her dream New Zealand debut. Jess Drummond was forced to request some more relief cover this week after being stunned with a surprise call-up to the Black Ferns sevens team for the Canada leg of the HSBC World Series. She flew out of Auckland on Monday. Already a New Zealand touch rugby representative, Drummond could become a dual international if she makes her debut at this weekend's tournament in Victoria.

"I'm pretty excited and pretty overwhelmed," Drummond said after receiving the good news. "I've already got the nerves. I've just gotta know how to control that and put my best foot

forward and prove I deserve to be there. I know I need to step up because those other girls aren't there."

With five regulars unavailable due to 15s commitments, New Zealand coach Allan Bunting was always going to be on the hunt for some new blood and Drummond was fully aware that she was playing for a place on the plane when she was invited to train with the squad in Mt Maunganui last week. She had already travelled with the squad to the Dubai tournament in a non-playing capacity last year and was part of the New Zealand development team that played six games in Japan recently. But representing her country in the World Series has always been the No 1 dream so she was unsurprisingly "lost for words" to hear her name read out in the 12-person squad.

"I thought I had a chance of making the 14, but to make the 12. It just blew me away really."

A teacher at Richmond School, Drummond said it didn't take long for the news to reach her students and their parents, and she was pretty excited to know they will be cheering her on from back home.

"I've had so many messages just saying how excited they are, that they can't wait to follow and wishing me the best. The support from the kids and their parents is just phenomenal.

"The school is amazing. They said they'd get a reliever, and that they support me 100 per cent."




GLENNA ARMSTRONG – LEAD PERFORMER




