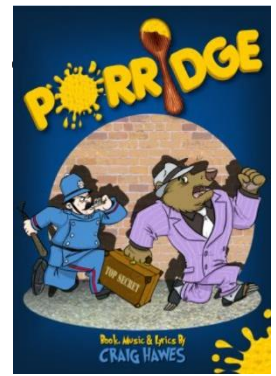

The five-step test

A child can ride **safely** without a booster
seat when you can say YES to ALL 5.

- 1 Back against the vehicle seat
- 2 Knees bend at edge of seat
- 3 Lap belt low on tops of thighs
- 4 Shoulder belt between neck and shoulder
- 5 Sit properly, no slouching, leaning over, etc

To ride safely,
most kids
need a booster
until age
10 - 12 years.
It's best to wait
till 148cm.
