ANNUAL SWIMMING PROGRAMME AT THE AQUATIC CENTRE

For the past eleven years, the local *SwimMagic* organisation at the Richmond Aquatic Centre has provided a series of professionally taught swimming lessons to help improve swimming and water safety skills for our children.

Every child receives 10 lessons within a small ability group, taken by a fully trained *SwimMagic* instructor. Each lesson lasts 25 minutes (followed by a 5 minute change-over) and then the class has 25 minutes using other pool facilities to learn about water safety and to practise swimming skills.

Richmond School has opted into the Ministry 'Opt-in' donation scheme again this year, so involvement is <u>free</u> this year for every child.

We will bus the children to and from the Aquatic Centre for their daily lessons for 2 weeks (10 days). We take two classes at the same time.

Parents will receive a hardcopy of a more detailed newsletter with a permission form for parents to complete. Please return this to your child's classroom teacher as soon as possible. We require a permission form back for all children.

Although these lessons are not compulsory, we are hopeful parents will see the terrific opportunity this will be for improving their children's swimming skills. If students do not attend these lessons, they will remain at school and continue with other school tasks in another classroom.

ACCORD DAYS

At the end of 2022, the Ministry of Education made the decision that schools were to have four Accord Days during 2023 and 2024. **These are teacher-only days and schools are closed on those days.**

Accord Days are professional development days where teachers will be at school, and the days are about schools strengthening their schooling curriculum and assessment systems to support the 'NZ Curriculum Refresh'. The 'Curriculum Refresh' is the government's latest initiative to revamp the NZ curriculum so teachers will be updated about the new initiative and then determining how to implement it.

Our first Accord Day was held on Monday 24th April. Earlier in the year we notified parents our second one would be on Friday 20th October (Term 4). However, the Ministry of Education in their wisdom have now decreed the second Accord Day has to be held in a 2 week period determined by them. So, we are having to change this to comply with this requirement. Our local schools are endeavouring to have this on the same day. It is likely to be <u>Friday 17th November</u> 2023. I will confirm this as soon as the final decision has been made.


RICHMOND SCHOOL'S WEBSITE

CHANGES TO WENSLEY ROAD/CRESCENT STEET AND CHURCH STREET

In an effort to improve safety for pedestrians and our school children the TDC has designed some street modifications. School management and the Board have been in discussions with the TDC about the dangers of vehicles travelling the wrong way down Church St (against the law). Our main concern is around our children crossing the street to the back field. The back field belongs to Richmond School (yes it is very strange we have a street through the centre of our school!). Safety is paramount. The attached letter indicates that movable bollards will be in place for a trial 12 month period at the crossing by the main PE shed/bike enclosure entrance. The street will be closed from 8:30am – 4:00pm on school days.

Church Street safety improvements

This is to let you know that we are working with Richmond School to make safety improvements for students on Church Street.

We are planning to close the street to through traffic on weekdays during school hours 8.30am to 4pm Monday to Friday, so students can cross the road between the school and sports grounds in a stee school and sports grounds.

We plan to instal permanent bollards in the footpath and install removable bollards across the road on the raised crossing that the school will manage and control. The intention is for the road to be closed prior to school starting each morning then opened at the end of the school day.


A cycle lane through the closed area will remain open always allowing bike and foot access. At this stage we are planning to do the works during the July school holidays and intend to run the trial closure for 12-months.




REPORTS & INTERVIEWS
