

UPDATE ABOUT THE SECOND ACCORD DATE 2023

At the end of 2022, the Ministry of Education made the decision that schools were to have four Accord Days during 2023 and 2024. **These are teacher-only days and schools are** <u>closed</u> **on those days.**

Accord Days are professional development days where teachers will be at school, and the days are about schools strengthening their schooling curriculum and assessment systems to support the 'NZ Curriculum Refresh'. The 'Curriculum Refresh' is the government's latest initiative to revamp the NZ curriculum so teachers will be updated about the new initiative and then determining how to implement it.

Our first Accord Day was held on Monday 24th April. Earlier in the year we notified parents our second one would be on Friday 20th October (Term 4). However, the Ministry of Education in their wisdom have now decreed the second Accord Day has to be held in a 2-week period determined by them. So, we are having to change this to comply with this requirement.

Our local Waimea schools have set this day to be Monday 20th November 2023.

POUNAMU PENDANTS

Last week the following statement was included in the newsletter. We have had 2 families/businesses who have generously offered to help fund these. They would appreciate another family/business or two to help out. Of course we will recognise people's generosity at the Final Assembly and in newsletters.

"At the final assembly of the year, our Year 6 leavers receive a leaving certificate and a photo of all our Year 6s and their teachers. Young actors tackle mysteries in Porridge



Richmond School's young acting talent will be solving mysteries in their production of Porridge.

Richmond School pupils will be unravelling a plethora of mysteries in their production of 'Porridge' during three shows at the Hope Community Church this week.

Porridge focuses on the community of Happy Valley that experiences a crime wave and a caseload of mysteries to be solved, from a kidnapped cow to a missing recipe book.

It is down to private detective Jack Spratt to uncover the truth, including the dirty secret Papa Bear is hiding behind his porridge empire.

One of the teachers driving the production, Grant Irvine, says the biennial production involves 180 children aged between nine and 11 and involves dancing, singing, acting and a fair dose of dad jokes.

"It's amazing to see children tentative at the start and now blossoming. It's brilliant for their self-management and working cooperatively with a group.

"Then taking it to the Hope Community Church and performing for their family takes it to the next level again."

He says students are often hesitant to put their hands up for performing roles, but once they get a taste of it, they wish they had taken up more opportunities.

In the past the school has written its own shows, which Grant says is great but also a huge effort.

So this year it has purchased Porridge and that creates a different type of show for the school.

The cast get the chance to perform four times on stage, including a dress rehearsal and then two evening performances and a matinee show.

Tickets are on sale at the school office with shows on Wednesday 21 June at 7pm and Thursday 22 June at 12pm and 7pm.


