From the Tumuaki desk this week ...

KAREAREA SYNDICATE FOCUS ON WATER TERM 1

As part of a water-focused learning module, Prashanti Lovegrove from the TDC Community Engagement team and Andrea Goodwin from the Waters Infrastructure team conducted interactive sessions with five senior classes at Richmond School. These sessions covered topics such as drinking water, wastewater, and stormwater. Nearly 150 children participated, learning how the Waimea Dam replenishes groundwater during dry periods to ensure a year-round supply of drinking water. They also discovered that water entering outside drains flows untreated into our streams, while wastewater from inside the house is treated at the Bells Island wastewater treatment plant before being released into the ocean.

The children engaged in various activities, including connecting pipes on interactive boards, examining maps filled with pipelines, and simulating water flow through a catchment model. They also discussed how unwanted contaminants end up in the stormwater system and ways to prevent this. The feedback from the children was overwhelmingly positive, and everyone had a fun and educational day.

OUR PARENT-TEACHER COMMITTEE (PTC)

Richmond School is super fortunate to have an exceptional Parent-Teacher Committee. Last year, the PTC raised over \$17,700 during the year to provide a number of 'extras' around the school.

Recent projects have been - the new sound system in the school hall and new adventure playground equipment. At last Monday's PTC meeting, they confirmed they are raising funds this year for new playground equipment on the back field and a new gazebo for the school to erect when we have major school events including our participation in the annual Nelson Tryathlon.

The PTC raises funds by holding events such as BBQ sausage sizzles, an annual disco and raffles. However, the PTC is more than a fundraising committee. Being a member is a great way to get to know other school parents. Furthermore (although your children won't necessarily tell you) it demonstrates to your children how much you value their education.

As the name suggests, there are a number of staff members on the PTC. Parents join the committee on a voluntary basis. The committee meets about twice a term in the school's staff meeting at 7:00pm with most meetings lasting no more than an hour and a half. Typically, there are 12 – 20 members at the meetings. They have a great social time.

Associated with the PTC is another group known as the 'Friends of the Committee' who are parents who can't necessarily attend PTC meetings but are more than willing to help out by cooking sausage sizzles and so on.



There are 3 parents who chair the PTC. Namely, Amy Henley, Christine Irvine and Vanessa Jones. The latter two also being school Board members.

AUTHOR VISIT






If you would like to see Colleen for yourselves, she is speaking at the Elmer Turner library this Sunday at 2pm.
